Dear Louisiana Board of Ethics,

I am writing to dispute the late fee assessment. I have attempted many times to call the Louisiana Board of Ethics, left voice mails for assistance in understanding the process of what was expected of me. I never got a return call, ever. I even went to the Clerk of Court in Colfax, Louisiana, and they assisted me to the best of their ability, which I am grateful for. I did not understand this process and the timeline to do certain things. When I did call, the personnel on your end was just rude and unprofessional. I know that isn't helping my case any, and they probably go through hundreds of calls a day, but it is no excuse for lacking tact when someone like me calls and gets treated like a second-class citizen.

I am a retired military veteran that started my career in the 82nd Airborne Division and completed my service in the Special Forces as a Senior Intelligence Sergeant. I have eleven combat tours and am a disabled veteran. Upon my last combat deployment, I was coming home from Afghanistan, and my wife got killed in a vehicle accident coming to pick me up from the airport. I was left raising our 4yo and 2yo daughters on my own. That was on January 10, 2011. I now have two sons also, a 2yo and a 1yo. I have custody of my four children and am raising them on my military retirement of \$2,132.77 a month retirement check. I am well below the poverty line in Louisiana, yet I make it work without the aid of government assistance, even though I'm qualified for it. Paying a \$2,000 fine would be a hardship on me and my family as it is almost 1/10th of what I make per year.

My ambition to run for Sheriff of Grant Parish is simple. My younger brother Michael Chelette was killed in a vehicle accident on July 3, 2019 in Montgomery, Louisiana. I could see my wife's grave from where he died at. I was one of the first people on the scene and the deputies there laughed and joked over his body. I was livid over their lack of professionalism. Plus, my tax dollars were used by the Sheriff's Office in Grant Parish for patrol cars to put re-election signs in people's yards and to recover them after the election was over. I ran for Sheriff, so shouldn't the deputies have put my campaign signs up and recovered them also with my tax dollars that funds them? No. The corruption and unprofessionalism here drove me to run for Sheriff not knowing all the ins and outs of what I was getting myself into. This being one of them.

On top of everything else I have going on in my life, I am also a student at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Louisiana where I am currently in my Senior year pursuing a degree in Criminal Justice at 50 years old, well over twice the age of the average student enrolled there. The duties of finishing my degree and raising a family can be overwhelming at times, but I am determined to succeed at both without fail. If I am required to stand in front of a judge, I am prepared to walk the 160 miles from my residence in Grant Parish to have my case heard. I may be disabled, but I am not incapable. I only request I be given a week notice so that I can make it on time on foot. Therefore, I respectfully request that this fee be dismissed so I can move forward with my life and not have a financial disruption that will affect me nor my children in any adverse way.
