
Dear Senator Amedee:

Part I. Board of Ethics

Chapter 17. Code of Governmental Ethics

§1703. Food and Drink Limit

A. In accordance with R.S. 42:1115.1(C), beginning on July 1, 2013, the limit for food, drink or refreshments provided in R.S. 42:1115.1A and B is \$57.

**FISCAL AND ECONOMIC IMPACT
STATEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE RULES
RULE TITLE: Food and Drink Limit**

I. ESTIMATED IMPLEMENTATION COSTS (SAVINGS) TO STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS (Summary)

The estimated cost to implement the rule, which sets forth the amended monetary limit on the receipt of food and drink by a public servant and public employee, is \$168 in FY 13-14, which accounts for the cost to publish the Notice of Intent and the rule in the State Register. The proposed administrative Rule raises the monetary limit on the receipt of food and drink from \$56 to \$57 in FY 14.

II. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON REVENUE COLLECTIONS OF STATE OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS (Summary)

The proposed Rule will have no anticipated effect on revenue collections of state or local governmental units.

III. ESTIMATED COSTS AND/OR ECONOMIC BENEFITS TO DIRECTLY AFFECTED PERSONS OR NONGOVERNMENTAL GROUPS (Summary)

The proposed action will affect all public employees and public servants by setting a monetary limit on the receipt of food and drink.

IV. ESTIMATED EFFECT ON COMPETITION AND EMPLOYMENT (Summary)

The proposed Rule change will have no anticipated effect on competition and employment.
